Founded in 1890, Texas Wesleyan is the longest-serving higher education institution in Fort Worth. This year, after a 75-year hiatus, Texas Wesleyan is excited to bring football back to campus.

- For six years in a row, we have been ranked in the No. 1 tier of regional universities in the West by *U.S. News & World Report*.
- 85 percent of our more than 140 full-time faculty members hold a doctorate or highest degree in their field.
- Our School of Business Administration is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International, the premier accreditor of business schools in the world. AACSB accreditation is earned by less than five percent of the world's business programs.
- While our diverse undergraduate student body represents 53 different countries from around the world, half (53 percent) of our undergraduates are from Tarrant County.
- Undergraduate students received more than \$18.9 million in scholarships, institutional grants and financial aid (federal and state grants and student loans) in Fall 2015.
- The \$6.7 million Rosedale Renaissance Project has revitalized both our campus and the Polytechnic neighborhood by creating a critical thinking hub in East Fort Worth.
- New domestic freshmen enrollment has increased 19 percent since the “Smaller. Smarter.” marketing campaign debuted in 2012. To date, the campaign has won 69 local and national marketing and advertising awards.
- The School of Education established the first bilingual/English-as-a-Second Language program in North Texas more than 40 years ago.
- Our biological sciences department allows undergraduates to participate in research, such as sequencing DNA or purifying RNA, which is usually reserved for graduate students at other universities.
- Texas Wesleyan is home to Dallas/Fort Worth's only theatre department with more than 60 years of production of a spring musical.
- Athletic achievements include 12 national championships in table tennis, six NAIA men's golf national championships, one NAIA men's basketball national championship, and numerous conference championships.
- Named a “Military Friendly School” six years in a row by *Victory Media*.
- Our graduate program of nurse anesthesia is one of the largest in the country with 21 primary clinical sites in 9 states.
