- » Bring in up to 60 credit hours directly from your completed Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree
- » Fast-track your graduation by earning up to an additional 15 credits awarded for Credit for Prior Learning (CPL), including military service, technical certifications and professional work experience.
- » Stay on budget with a competitive, differentiated tuition rate of \$350 per credit hour.*
- » Navigate your degree with one-on-one advising and dedicated faculty mentorship in a close-knit campus community where you are a name, not a number.
- » By maximizing your transfer credits and CPL, you can significantly shorten your path to graduation. (Requires a 45-hour institutional residency requirement.)
