

Course Design Institute 2017

The Course Design Institute:

- Brings a cohort of up to 12 faculty together for four days to begin designing or transforming a learning-centered course that embodies teaching excellence
- Focuses on course and syllabus design that reflects the alignment of student outcomes, performance tasks, and learning activities
- Consists of workshops, peer feedback, reflection, and opportunities to consult individually with CETL staff

Participants Will Answer the Following Questions During the Institute

1. **What short- and long-term goals drive my decisions about the content I include in the course? What differentiates students who take my class from those who don't?**

Participants will:

- Create concept maps and solicit feedback from colleagues to ensure that verbal explanations of the course match its visual representation
- Establish measurable course- and unit-level student outcomes

2. **What are my students really learning? Do the assessments align with both the course goals and unit outcomes?**

Participants will:

- Examine Fink's taxonomy of significant learning and discuss how to incorporate the six dimensions of significant learning into their courses
- Identify performance tasks that reflect real-world application of what students are learning
- Plan at least one major assessment, along with a grading rubric, for inclusion in the syllabus

3. **How do I support student learning?**

Participants will:

- Frame the syllabus as a guide to the course that influences motivates students and situates the purpose of the course within a broader context
- Write a course introduction that inspires students and explains the instructor's commitment to developing a learning partnership with students
- Describe opportunities for formative assessment and individualized feedback throughout the course

4. How do my students learn?

Participants will:

- Identifying active learning strategies that foster deeper learning
- Structure series of activities that keep students engaged with the instructor, the content, and one another
- Consider instructional technologies that support student engagement and learning

About the Faculty Course Design Institute

Who? Full-time and adjunct faculty who want to design or transform a Fall 2017 course. Space is limited to 12 faculty participants.

What? The four-day Course Design Institute is hosted by the Center for Excellence in Teaching and Learning. Participants will leave with approximately 85% of a completed syllabus that includes course- and unit-level outcomes, instructions and a rubric for at least one major assessment, and other elements [as outlined in the Syllabus Rubric](#) created by the University of Virginia's Teaching Resource Center.

When? Monday, May 22 through Thursday, May 25. The registration deadline is Monday, May 15.
