BRAG CORNER

Our School of Education students and faculty are up to big things. Here are just a few of our favorite bragging points.

- Based on data from CREATE, an organization that tracks data on all teacher preparation institutions in Texas, the Texas Wesleyan Teacher Preparation Program consistently produces graduates whose longevity in the classroom as teachers are greater than both the average of all Texas public and private universities.
- Texas Wesleyan was the recipient of a \$2 million federal grant in 2018, leading to the funding of 35 scholarships for certified bilingual teachers.
- Since 2000, Texas Wesleyan education majors have been able to get real-life teaching experience while leading lessons with Fort Worth ISD students during the annual “First Day of College” event.
- Ed.D. graduates have recorded a 100 percent passing rate on the Texas Superintendent Certification exam.
- TXWES senior athletic training students Julio Ibarra and Breanne Zuniga were selected to present their research during the free communication poster presentation at the Southwest Athletic Trainers’ Association Annual Meeting and Clinical Symposia.
- Most exercise science students who complete an internship are offered full-time employment at those internship sites where they studied.
- Two professors from the School of Education received the Quest for Quality Award: Exemplary School Partnership. The Texas Association of Teacher Education, in conjunction with the Consortium of State Organizations for Texas Teacher Education, presented the award to the professors at the organization’s annual conference.
