Gallery Mission Statement:

The mission of the gallery is to educate, serve, enrich and encourage appreciation and understanding of visual art through direct engagement with original works of art. Through exhibitions, the gallery provides a central place for visitors to see these works of art.

The gallery allows faculty, students, staff and the community an opportunity to teach, reflect, research and interpret the creative accomplishments of artists through different exhibitions and examples from Texas Wesleyan's permanent art collection.

Exhibitions:

The Bernice Coulter Templeton Art Studio Gallery is the main exhibition space at Texas Wesleyan University. Along with serving as a teaching tool, the gallery exhibits the works of students, faculty, local, regional, and national artists. Most exhibits include an artist lecture and reception, allowing the artists to connect with both students and the community. Exhibitions are free and open to the public.

The University Art Gallery invites proposals for solo, group and curated exhibitions. An Art Exhibition Committee, made up of community members, art professionals and art faculty will review all submitted proposals. Three exhibition proposals are accepted each academic year. Specific installation, reception, artist lecture and breakdown dates are dependent on the University Academic Calendar and will be communicated to accepted artists/curators.

Exhibition Period 1	August – October, 2018
Exhibition Period 2	October – December, 2018
Exhibition Period 3	January – March, 2019

Submission Guidelines:

This call for exhibition proposals is open to all interested persons domestically and internationally, including the students, faculty, and staff of Texas Wesleyan University. The application process is due on January 27, 2018. To apply:

- a) Submit 3-5 images (jpg format, less than 5mb each) of original artworks that support your proposal.
- b) Include a short bio paragraph.
- c) Include your contact information.
- d) State your preferred exhibition period.

All entries must be original and executed by the guest curator or submitting artist(s). Incomplete and/or late entries will not be reviewed.
