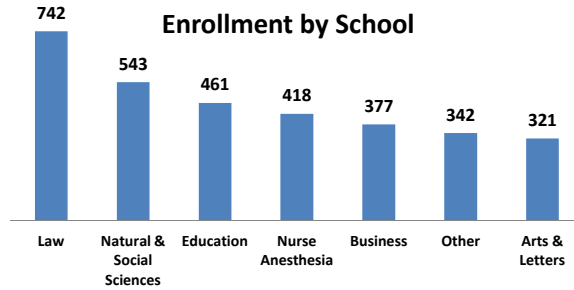

# Undergraduate Enrollment 1,794

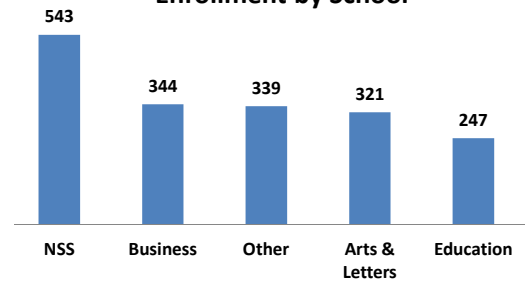

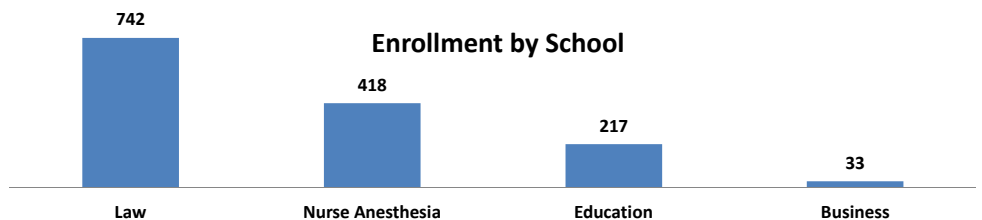
## Enrollment by Gender

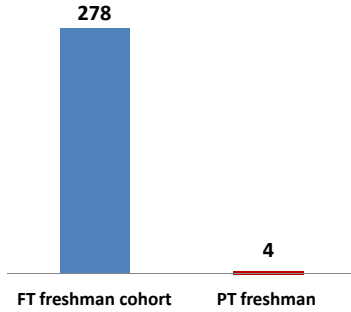

Enrollment by Gender



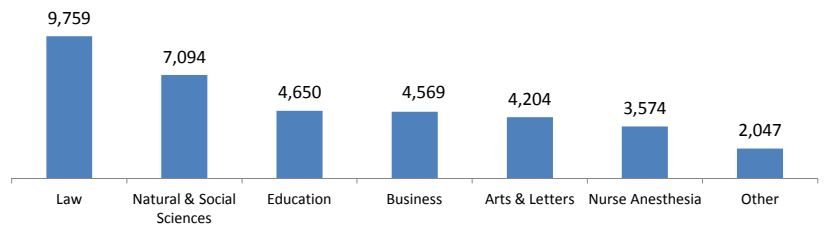

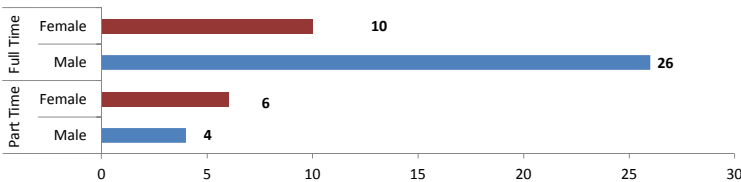


## Total Credit Hours by School



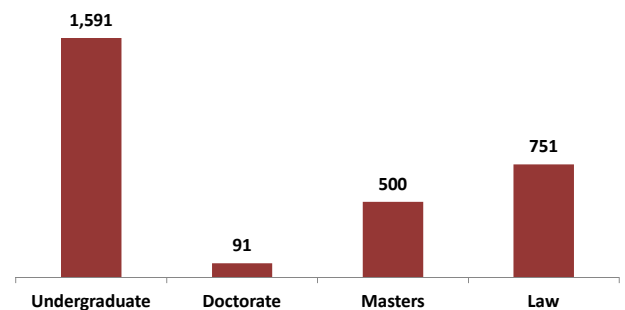

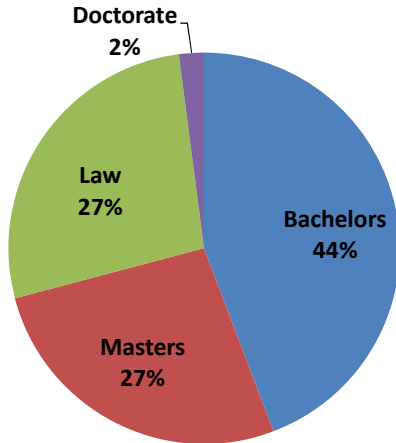
