

Description:

This session introduces this plagiarism detection and homework (papers) management service. After receiving student paper submissions for your class, the service provides for individualized electronic marking and grading of the paper, plagiarism detection, reporting and communication with students.

Prerequisite:

Faculty must have an individual Turnitin account. If you do not have an account, please send an email to cetl@txwes.edu to request one before attending this workshop.

Objectives:

After completing this workshop participants will be able to:

- Login to the Turnitin website.
- Create a class and invite students to it.
- Create an assignment for students and locate student resources on the Turnitin website.
- Manually submit student papers to an assignment.
- Track and review individual student status within the class system.
- View, download and print the Originality Report on individual papers submitted.
- Access additional resources and training materials from the Turnitin website.
- *(Optional as time permits)* Provide feedback via markings and grades on submitted student work.

Materials:

Internet connection and instructional handout provided.

Activities:

Participants will interactively create a demo class and assignment that they may use to help teach their students about both the Turnitin tool as well as the ethical and legal ramifications of plagiarism. Participants will also discuss and brainstorm the applications of a plagiarism detection tool in their classes.
